
Mary proclaimed hope in a God who was and who is making all things new in Christ. May it be so again this season!





Meet the New General Manager of KCMR Amy Kuns

KCMR radio was created by Trinity Lutheran Church and went on the air on May 3, 1979. The only listener-supported, locally owned and operated radio station in Mason City, this non-commercial Christian station offers easy-listening, inspirational music, along with hourly news and weather reports. Since its beginning, there have been many changes, and a recent one took place mid-August of this year when Amy Kuns became the new General Manager of the station.

If her name sounds familiar to you, it's because she's not only from the North Iowa area, but she also was probably "in" your home nightly in the 1990s. Kuns grew up in Ventura and after graduating from Northwestern College in Roseville, MN, she came back to the area to be an unpaid intern at KIMT-TV, doing practically everything at the station except for sports and weather, and finally becoming the evening anchor, her dream job. "It was everything I wanted," Kuns said, "until it wasn't!"

It was her mom's words at that time that still resonate with her today: "Amy, dreams CHANGE!" When life changes, so do dreams. Kuns found herself as a Communication instructor at Waldorf College (now University) for a year. She loved the job and her students, but found herself missing TV, so she moved to Rochester, MN to take an anchor job at FOX 47 for the next five years.

Kuns explained that TV can be an unpredictable business. All of a sudden, her FOX 47 contract wasn't renewed, so off she went again...this time to Washington state where she took an anchor job at KEPR-TV. Two months in, the management decided "the chemistry wasn't right" between her co-anchor and her, so she was out of a job after uprooting her life and moving to the west coast. Two weeks after that, her co-anchor was also let go. "That's how brutal the TV industry is!" Kuns said.

What followed Amy's broadcasting career was something even she never saw coming. "I flailed for two decades working in various jobs from restaurants to retail and selling cars to hospitality," she said. "Nothing felt right or paid enough to support a single mom with a young son." Kuns said she felt like she couldn't afford to live. "During those two decades, I was angry with God. I kept asking, 'Why? Why is this not working out?!?'"

Her turning point came this past April when Dureen Bradshaw, church secretary at Agape Christian Family Church in Clear Lake, realized that Kuns needed some extra TLC and offered her and her son the apartment above the sanctuary. "It was a safe, peaceful place to be for the first time in two decades," Kuns said with tears in her eyes. It allowed her to focus on what she really wanted. "God spoke to me like He was sitting next to me," she explained. "I heard, 'Amy, I've got this. You're going to be okay.'"



A few months later, she found out about the KCMR position, got the job, and now lives in a nice rental home in Clear Lake with her son, Cooper.

"KCMR is a really good fit for me at this time of my life," Kuns said. She not only gets to use her knowledge of broadcasting, which was her major in college, but she also pointed out another commonality between her alma mater and the radio station. "I thrive in a small Christian environment!" she exclaimed.

The environment of this nonprofit radio station with on-air volunteers checks off all the boxes for Kuns. She raved about the staff and volunteers and the direction the station is going. "It's music-driven, not talk-driven," she explained, although she does have some ideas for future podcasts. Other ideas include moving into more contemporary Christian music to gain younger listeners... while still playing the favorites so as not to alienate the older ones.

A goal is to double the number of volunteer announcers. If someone wants to be on-air at KCMR, Kuns said no experience is necessary. "We train you!" she said. "All you need is a love of music and a love of touching people with the news of Jesus Christ and you're golden!" An average shift for a radio announcer at KCMR is 2-3 hours and can vary from one weekly shift up to two or three. This music-filled "gig" sounds perfect for a person looking to expand his or her faith journey.

In fact, Kuns pointed out being the new GM is perfect for her own faith journey as well. "I was looking for something to stretch my own Christian faith and trust in God while using my broadcasting capabilities, and this job fits the bill!" When people ask how her new job is going, her stock answer with a smile on her face and a twinkle in her eye is this: "This job is everything I didn't know I wanted!!"




CASEY, CASSIDY, TEAGAN & LONDON HARRIS


SHEA, MICHAEL, FINN & CALVIN JORGENSEN




